
from the Brighouse manse, but it is also part-canal and part-river! Calder & Hebble Navigation, here I come.

Eco Church



There is a growing movement within the national churches to look at the challenge of climate change and to bring about much needed change throughout the districts, circuits, and local churches.

In a recent report, 'Hope in God's Future: Christian Discipleship in the Context of Climate Change', representatives from the Baptist Union, the Methodist Church, and the United Reformed Church grapple with the subject of climate change within the context of Christian theology. It is a challenging report which calls the church to repentance and action.

They challenge the church to 'discover the current level of our greenhouse gas emissions and identify a strategy to enable an audit of greenhouse gas emissions at all levels of the church, so that local churches, regional structures, and national church institutions become aware of the starting point for

action to reduce greenhouse gas emissions'.


When it comes down to it, we have a long way to go to make the necessary changes and yet, everything is possible. Throughout the UK many churches are turning to A Rocha, eco church programme. Eco Church is a free, online, reward scheme designed to equip your church to work towards environmentally friendly practices and it seeks to show that the Church is good news for God's earth. On signing up on their website you will be invited to complete an online questionnaire and on occasion you may even find that your church is already in line for a certificate.



As a circuit it is vital that we seek ways to challenge our Carbon Footprint. The Circuit Meeting has recently placed ECO church on its agenda, and we are seeking volunteers to form a circuit Eco Group to meet three times a year to work alongside churches and the wider circuit to address this vital work. Team have worked tirelessly to bring our building scheme to fruition and as a church family we continue to look to a future with a new Church Building that is warm, dry and welcoming to all. Sadly because of increasing costs in almost all walks of life, we now know that the build will cost more than was originally hoped – but with God's help, lots of prayers and the continued generosity of the church family we are sure that we will eventually reach our goal of this lovely new building.

A decision was recently made by the Church Council that we put forward to all the necessary bodies that we split the build into two phases – the first phase being the main church building, followed by landscaping and car parking works etc forming the second phase of the works. Hopefully this will mean that we can start the work sooner rather than later.

We have recently been awarded a very generous grant from the Community Foundation for Calderdale for fossil fuel free heating equipment to help St. Andrew's play its part in slowing climate change and for this we are very grateful.

All this of course means that we will need to raise as much money as possible, as quickly as possible, therefore our fundraising events will continue to follow on from those things that have taken place over the summer months, i.e.



ST. PAUL'S

St Paul's is very fortunate to have a long tradition of Scouting and Girl Guiding groups as part of our youth and next month, they will celebrate 90 years at St Paul's!

90YEARS

As well as weekly meetings, the 24th St Paul's Scout group also organise two annual fundraising events which are open to the general public:

The Calderdale Hike - an event attracting runners and walkers from all over the country coming to follow routes of 16, 26, and 36 miles in April each year.

The Calderdale Mountain Bike Marathon - an event attracting cyclists from all over the country coming to follow a set route of 26 miles in October each year.



This year they have, very generously, used some of their proceeds from these events to purchase a defibrillator for the church. After a professional demonstration, it quickly became apparent that keeping this life saving equipment within the building was not going to help if a medical emergency, nearby, required it when the church was locked up! Therefore, it was decided to buy a cabinet and site it outside.



The SPYS group (St Paul's Youth Support) a group set up after the 75th Anniversary to support the youth groups, took on the responsibility of ordering the cabinet, along with its installation and registration, and the defibrillator is now on the corner of our church building ready for use.

Whilst we hope the defibrillator will never be needed, its presence will bring some reassurance to those in our neighbourhood and further confirms us as a church which seeks to serve the wider community.
